Eligibility

Seniors who have declared their intent to pursue higher education or training in any field upon graduation are eligible.

Materials needed to apply

- o Read this guide sheet

- o Complete the application form

Entry requirements

- o One submission per student.
- Writing may be in the form of poetry, essay, short story, journalism (news or editorial). Illustrated entries are accepted, but the writing is what earns points.
- o Narrative entries must be 3-5 pages. Poetry length depends on type, which student must identify. If poetry, student must provide rules/standards for type of poetry.
- O Student selects topic, which must focus on natural world. Possible, but not limited to, approaches are (1) communicate student's interaction with or feelings about nature; (2) explore a problem/solution affecting the natural world; (3) persuade others how and why to support and celebrate the richness of nature; (4) describe a beautiful, inspiring or powerful aspect of nature; (5) other approaches that illustrate student's connection with nature.
- All entries must be typed in 12 point font, double-spaced and stapled.

Complete application form, staple entry/standards to it and mail to contact below, postmarked by March 15, 2019 or deliver in person by 4:30 p.m., March 22 to Willard High School.
